So, here's what I want you to do, God helping you: Take your everyday, ordinary life—your sleeping, eating, going-to-work, and walking-around life—and place it before God as an offering. Romans 12:1

1. The movie Father Stu is about a boxer that has taken too many blows to the head, so he decides to try acting while working at a grocery store. Jesus gets ahold of him and starts to change him before he is called into the ministry.
2. Work was a part of the world that God made but when sin entered the picture it messed up everything including work, but Jesus came to this earth to reverse the curse (read Genesis 3:17-19 and Luke 19:10).
3. All work that is done in faith is sacred and should be done to glorify and honor God (read Colossians 3:23). When you are working for the Lord, there's a joy inside of you. Is your mindset that you are working for your boss or paycheck instead of working for the Lord? What can you do to change your perspective?
4. Pastor Ken talked about the idea of Holy Spirit Job Crafting. It is thinking of yourself at work with God in the world. Take the work that you do and connect it to His purpose and view it as a calling no matter what kind of work it is. Make the world better or more beautiful through your painting, gardening, cooking, nursing, styling hair, or serving your community as a police officer, fire fighter or soldier. If you are a teacher or author, make the world wiser. Plug in whatever job you have; it is all sacred in the eyes of God and can glorify and honor Him.
