Jesus the Son

This past weekend Pastor EC continued the series, *Creed*. We are looking at three of the major beliefs from the Apostles Creed, a summary of fundamental Christian teachings found in the Bible. We invite you to journey with someone at work, your family, or find a place to do it alone or with a friend. Let's grow and do life together during this series.

And we also thank God continually because, when you received the word of God, which you heard from us, you accepted it not as a human word, but as it actually is, the word of God, which is indeed at work in you who believe.

1 Thessalonians 2:13

1. The first part of the Creed that we looked at last week set Christianity apart from all the other religions in the world by declaring that the only true and living God is powerful and personal at the same time. This week the second part goes even farther in setting Christianity apart by acknowledging the person and work of God's son, Jesus Christ. The three themes are His divinity, His humanity, and His work while He was on earth and now in heaven (read John 1:1-3, 8:58, 14:6-11; Romans 8:34; Philippians 2:5-7; Colossians 1:15-20; and Hebrews 7:28).
2. Jesus was fully God and fully human. He was conceived by the Holy Spirit and miraculously born of the virgin Mary. He came into the world to suffer for us. There is a reference to Pontius Pilate, the fact that He was crucified, descended into hell. Is now seated in heaven making intercession for us and finally His 2nd coming.
3. Pastor EC focused on how Jesus is the cure for every crisis. If you need healing, freedom, or salvation, Jesus is the answer. If you are lonely, sick, or are hurting, Jesus is the cure. He is our high priest, our hope, and solid rock.
4. What is your need currently? Come to Jesus and receive His Love today. Forsake your sin and follow Him as a disciple. Pray and receive your healing or freedom from any addictions. Rejoice and receive His victory in your life over whatever is holding you back from all that God has for you.
